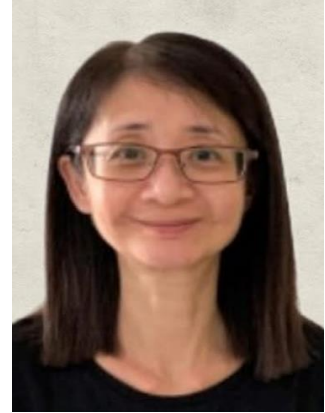
Iman Tang (School of Informatics & IT)
